The tournaments are going well and there have been a number of high scores. There are approximately 436 teams entered as of the writing of my report, with 253 Open and 183 Women's teams. This is down from the last year, however we are getting bowlers re-entering with different team members or doubles partners and a few new entries coming in, so this will help increase our numbers by the end of the tournaments run.

County Club Bowl Manager, Stacy Aldred and her staff have done a great job working with us and helping to keep the bowlers happy and the tournament running smoothly. The many Marin County USBC board members have done an awesome job greeting the bowlers, being score monitors and working the lanes. Thank you all so much for all you have done and will be doing for us as we head down the home stretch, you are greatly appreciated for a job well done!!!

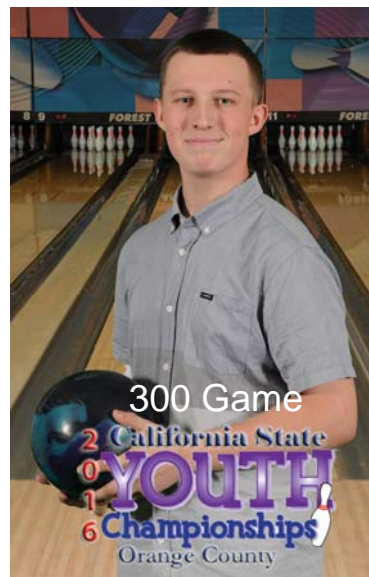

The 2017 California Pepsi Youth Bowling Championships is one of the longest tournaments held with league-level qualifying competition in November and January; District Finals held in March at eight different locations over two different weekends and then those qualifiers enter the State Finals that were just held this past May. A total of 396 bowlers participated in the U8 & U10 Divisions and 1,613 participated in the U12, U15 & U20 Divisions. The first place finishers in the U8 & U10 Divisions at the District Finals earned a FREE entry into the 2017 Youth State Championships to be held this July at Country Club Bowl in San Rafael and the first place finishers in the U12, U15 & U20 Divisions at the District Finals earned a \$50 scholarship plus a spot into the Semi-Finals of the Diddy Watts State Singles Challenge to be held at McHenry Bowl in Modesto August 12-13. Bowlers in the U8 & U10 Divisions would survive through two rounds of qualifying and three rounds of qualifying for the U12, U15 & U20 Divisions (all qualifying levels were based on scratch scores). 55 winners in the U8 & U10 Divisions will earn District Scratch Scholarships totaling \$8,005 and \$10,763 will be awarded in District Handicap Scholarships to 159 winners in all six divisions.

We had something new this year and teamed up with Down Lane Clothing. They are a local SoCal shirt company and we sold custom sublimated California Pepsi jerseys. The turned out great and best of all, we will receive a percentage from each shirt sales that went directly into this year's scholarship fund. We will come out with a new design for 2018, but this first style will always be available for purchase directly from their website at [DownLaneClothing.com](http://DownLaneClothing.com).

The State Finals were held at Classic Bowl on May 6-7. Bowlers in the U12, U15 & U20 divisions qualified to this level based on a ratio of 1:5 from District to State. We had 301 bowlers travel from across the state to attend and bowl in six game blocks. 33 of these bowlers will earn Scratch Scholarships totaling \$26,932. We also ran an optional Handicap Division, in which 190 bowlers participated and we will pay out \$1,900 to 19 bowlers. Six bowlers: **Joshua Abigania, Avery Domaguin, Chris Milne, Ranelle Ulanday, Ricky Pollom and Megan Ober**





earned the FREE berths into the USBC Junior Gold Finals in Cleveland, OH this July. Each of our six champions will receive a travel stipend up to \$400 for the Gold Finals along with their state scholarship and a custom embroidered jacket. All scholarship recipients will receive a scholarship packet and all funds will be held with USBC SMART. We will be distributing the scholarship packets at the California USBC Convention in Visalia on June 10-11 and will mail the remaining packets directly to each bowler. ## LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE

Legislative Committee Meeting  
January 19, 2017

Members Present:

Larry Worrall, Pauline Armstrong, Linda Stewart, Paul Kramer, Camelia Coffman, President Rosie Parker and Association Manager Larry Peppers.

The committee had 2 meetings. The first meeting Larry Peppers informed the committee that the State of California requires the State to pay workman's compensation for all officers based on an annual salary of \$42,000 a year whether they are paid or not. This money could be better used to fund other operations of the state.

The committee discussed ways to reduce this cost by reducing the size of the board. The impact on the board would be minimal since we have a number of current vacancies that could be eliminated. The committee recommended that we reduce the officers and move the eliminated officers to fill vacancies in the board positions.

At the second meeting, a list was prepared of the current officers and directors along with the recommended reductions. It was voted to change the current board of 5 officers, 12 adult directors and 6 youth directors to 3 officers, 10 adult directors and 5 youth directors.

To make these changes the proposal was to eliminate the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President and the Sergeant-at-Arms positions and move them to vacant director positions. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President position (youth only) will then become the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President also encouraging more youth participation on the state board.

The proposed bylaws will have to be adopted to accomplish the actions above.
